In 1613 a baby boy was born in the home of Rev. John Gillespie, Minister of the Old Kirk, the "thundering preacher".

George was to become a significant churchman, preacher and statesman in the Scotland of his time, and in 35 short years he left an indelible mark on the Scottish nation's culture with his contribution to the establishment of Presbyterianism. He was an author of the "Westminster Confession of Faith", still the subordinate standard for

all matters of theology, church government and worship in the Church of Scotland today, and in many other Presbyterian churches worldwide.

After his early death in 1648, his gravestone was desecrated on the orders of Archbishop Sharp, such were the religious conflicts of his day, and was only replaced 100 years later by his grandson, minister in Strathmiglo. This is the one still to be seen in the Old Kirk's south porch.


