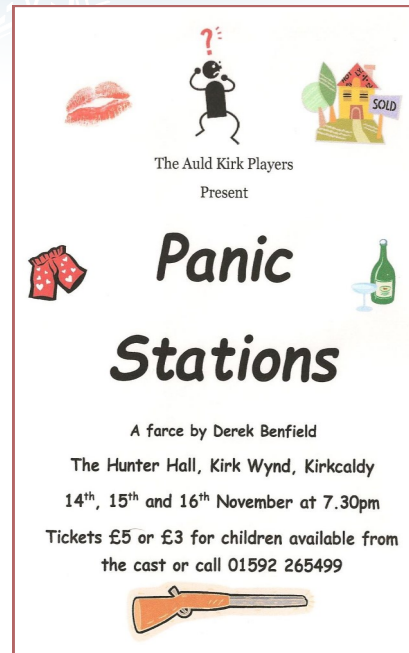

New Trustees for Hunter Hall & Downie Lounge

A Safer Path to the Old Kirk

On Monday 18th November work begins in the Old Kirk graveyard to repair the path which surrounds the building. It has suffered badly from the increased usage by cars since the Old Kirk became more frequented, and is now a very bumpy ride! When it rains more blue is

washed away and the resulting deep puddles are a delight to Peppa Pig fans but not to adult passers-by.

When finished, the new tarmac path will mean a smooth, easy access for wheelchair users and those with mobility prob-

lems. However all car access to the graveyard will be unavailable from 18th -21st November, and thereafter a collapsible bollard will be in place to restrict vehicle access to disabled drivers and official keyholders.

The history of the Hunter Trust begins in 1914 when John Hunter, local farmer and businessman, and elder of Kirkcaldy Old Kirk, transferred this property to the Hunter Trust, naming as its first Trustees the Minister, Session Clerk and 5 of the Old Kirk Session, who were to be replaced when they stood down by other members of the Old Kirk Session. No sale of the building was permitted nor was any debt to be incurred.

The first clause of the Deed bound the Trustees to providing a Christmas party for the poor children of Kirkcaldy with a new penny each and the Old Kirk was to have free use of the Halls.
