This year the Old Kirk will be open during Holy Week from 2pm to 3.30pm on Tuesday 27th March, Thursday 29th March and on Good Friday - Friday 30th March - as we prepare for the joy of Easter Day with opportunities for reflection.

Norman Milne will play on the Old Kirk organ at these times and you are welcome to come in for personal reflection, or to join in the Spiritual Tour of the church at 2.30pm. On Friday we focus at 2pm on "Why Good Friday is good?" in a short 20 minute consideration of the significance of the day.

On Easter Sunday we invite you to join our sister church St. Peter's Episcopal in a celebratory service at 10.30am.

We are very grateful to our volunteer organists, principally Norman Milne, who keep our fine Gern organ in good working order, by regularly putting it through its paces.

Now with the sponsorship of Edinburgh Society of Organists we have two fledgling organ scholars to learn the skills of the instrument in a shared venture with St. Peter's Episcopal Church.

If you are interested or know someone proficient in playing the piano who would



also like to learn the organ in future, please let us know.

On **Saturday 28th April** the Scottish Churches' Organist Training Scheme (SCOTS) will be holding a local workshop in the Old Kirk and St. Peter's under the tutelage of Douglas Galbraith, Matthew Beetschen and Richard Michael. SCOTS exists to encourage emerging organists as well as to assist those already in posts who wish to develop their skills.

The focus is not so much on achieving technical brilliance as on developing the gifts, skills and understanding to contribute to a more satisfying experience of worship for the whole congregation.

All interested church organists of whatever level are welcome to attend and should register for the day (10am - 3pm) with Ruth Irons (email ruthirons@icloud.com) to receive further details. The cost is £25 (£15 concession)



Repair and Restoration

Over the winter we have been without a significant feature in the Old Kirk: the right-hand Burne-Jones window, which was badly vandalised before we took over the Old Kirk, was removed last year and transported to Glasgow for repair and restoration. Its absence was even more noticeable when the "Beast from the East" blew directly against the temporary boarding!

We are now invited to see the progress of the work in the conservator's studio in Glasgow. The glass itself is repaired and cleaned and it is being framed in brass to refit it in the window space along with the protective glazing outside.
