

Happy Christmas - from Sir Edward Burne-Jones!

This year Kirkcaldy Old Kirk Trust sends you warmest greetings for Christmas in the form of Sir Edward Burne-Jones' stained glass window in the Old Kirk.

Now the oldest ones in the Kirk, these four windows on the East side contain a representation of the Nativity, with an angel watching over both Mary, the mother, and the focus of her attention, the infant Jesus. Joseph, watching over Him too, points to the Book, the Scriptures that foretell Him.

The Burne-Jones windows were executed at the works of William Morris, Merton Abbey, Surrey and were dedicated on 19th September 1886 by the Rev. Professor Milligan D.D. of permission to use it Aberdeen. They have been described by an art expert as perhaps the finest Burne-Jones windows still in situ.

The famous association of Burne-Jones with William Morris, Rossetti and other pre-Raphaelites produced the distinctive artistic emphasis evident in these windows. The tinted glasses give a delicate and wellbalanced scheme of colour and the natural leaf designs around them are typical of this style.

This summer we had a visit from Architectural Photographer Alastair Carew-Cox, who came from Worcestershire to photograph these windows for a beautifully illustrated book about Burne-Jones and the pre-Raphaelites. This image above is his copyrighted photo and we extend sincere thanks to him for here.

Alastair left with us a copy of the first volume of his work, "Angels



and Icons", a beautiful work of art in itself, which you can view at the Old Kirk. Now he and his colleague, William Waters, who writes the text, are seeking funding to publish the second volume "Damozels and Deities" with our windows in it This is no easy task and without financial help this important work may never be published.

The authors are now appealing to crowdfunding to raise £15,000 towards publication. You can follow their progress (almost the first

Civic Society Talk: 60 Years of Kirkcaldy in Film

Some rare glimpses of Kirkcaldy's past are the subject of Kirkcaldy Civic Society's talk by Bill Gourlay on Thursday 10th December at 7.30pm in the Old Kirk. Produced by local Talisman Films Limited, the film - 'Kirkcaldy Past and Present' - shows the ever changing face of the Lang Toun, featuring many unseen photographs and movie clips collected through the years.

Talisman Films' secretary Bill Gourlay will talk about the origins of the film with some illustrations.

"I was one of the founding members of Kirkcaldy Cine Club, despite the fact I didn't have a cine camera at the time!" he said. "I bought a cine camera in 1963 and decided I would film the various changes that were happening in Kirkcaldy, such as the demolition of Goodsirs Brae to make way for Ravenscraig Flats and changes in Mid Street, Nether Street and straightening the notorious Path.

"Over the years I filmed wholesale changes over the town, Barry's Factories, the last day of operation of Dysart and Sinclairtown stations, and the demolition of the Overton prefabs, to mention a few."
